# Visiting Scholar Rabbi Hanna Yerushalmi

Hanna Yerushalmi grew up in the Midwest, where kindness is a priority and listening is the first step in a relationship. And so relationships became the lens through which she has viewed the world. Over the years, this lens further propelled her to the rabbinate and working in relational life. Hanna served as a rabbi at Congregation Beth Or in Pennsylvania, and currently, Hanna is a licensed professional counselor and lives in Annapolis, Maryland, where, together with her husband, Rabbi Ari Goldstein, is raising four young adults by teaching them about kindness and the value of listening.

She is also the author of three books of poetry about Israel: A Strip of Land, October Shiva, and Let Us Be.

# IMPORTANT INFORMATION

#### Congregant and Guest Check-in

Upon arriving at Temple Israel, you will need to check in to receive your name tag before joining us for services in our Morris & Rose Kraft Sanctuary. Please plan to arrive early. Check-in will be in the David & Pauline Carter Ballroom. As always, there is open seating. Space is limited in the Kraft Sanctuary and our overflow seating will be in the Carter Ballroom, where our service will be streaming live.

#### Self and Valet Parking

In addition to our parking lot on Pine Street (accessible only from Dixie Highway), valet parking will be available. Our porte-cochère is available for drop-off/pick-up but vehicles cannot idle or stand. Flagler Drive vehicle access on Pine will be closed by the Police.

#### Additional Ways to Participate: Ushers, Greeters & Other Volunteers

Congregants can volunteer as ushers at one or more services—a great way to give back and meet new people! Ushers, identified by white carnations, will assist throughout the day. Please indicate if you would be willing to volunteer on the registration form by 8/31/2025.

#### Service Participation and Honors

Temple Israel honors members by inviting them to participate in High Holy Days services. Again this year, members will receive invitations from our rabbis, cantorial soloist, or the Honors Committee.

#### Tallitot and Kippot (Optional)

The Temple has a limited supply of tallitot and kippot available for use. A tallit is normally worn during daytime services only; the exception is Kol Nidre night, when it is also customary to wear one.
