# HIGH HOLY DAYS' INFORMATION

## BABYSITTING & CHILDREN'S PROGRAM

During our traditional *Rosh Hashanah* and *Yom Kippur* morning services, Temple Israel will provide babysitting for ages newborn to 2 years old and a "High Holy Days' Experience" for ages 3 through 3<sup>rd</sup> grade. It is crucial to register beforehand so that we will have the proper staffing on hand. A drink and snack will be provided. **You MUST RSVP by August 27<sup>th</sup> for Rosh Hashanah and by September 3<sup>rd</sup> for Yom Kippur.**

## TALLITOT

The Temple has a limited supply of *tallitot* available for use. A *tallit* is normally worn during daytime services only; the exception is *Kol Nidre* night, when it is also customary to wear one.

## USHERS

Members may indicate on the Ticket Order Form if they would like to be an usher during one of our services. Ushering is a wonderful way to help out while meeting new people and having the opportunity to say *Shanah Tovah!* Ushers will be on-site to assist members, guests and non-members throughout the day, and can be identified by the white carnation on their lapel.

Tickets are available to those members whose Annual Financial Commitment has been paid, or who are on a payment plan or have made special arrangements in advance. Please complete and return the High Holy Days' Ticket Order Form in order to attend services. Each family member will receive a ticket in his or her name; tickets are not transferable. Children through age 25 are welcome to attend services with their family at no additional charge but they also must have a ticket. If you have adult children, please encourage them to join Temple Israel; membership is free for those 30 years old and under.

## GUEST SEATING

Guests of members are welcome to sit with the member family. Cost of tickets: \$100 per out-of-county adult per holy day or \$125 per local adult per holy day. Tickets for children ages 12-18 years are \$50 per child per holy day. Children under 12, college students and active military are complimentary. Please complete and return the High Holy Days' Order Form in order to receive tickets for attendance.

## NON-MEMBER SEATING

Tickets are available to unaffiliated visitors for \$125 per adult per holy day and \$50 for each child ages 12-18 per holy day. Children under 12, college students and active military are complimentary. Please complete and return the High Holy Days' Order Form in order to receive tickets for attendance.
