From the President

Welcoming and Security

As Rabbi Olshein stated during a recent Friday night service, part of her role is to get us out of our comfort zone and to think about issues of social justice currently affecting us as citizens, Jews and congregants. Our Social Action Committee has been working with Rabbi Olshein to develop an exciting program which will raise difficult questions of social justice.

Commencing this fall, Temple Israel will hold panel discussions, called "Courageous Conversations" after certain specific Friday night services. The point of these Courageous Conversations is to educate us and then, move us to social action. Perhaps, through our Courageous Conversations, we can evolve into a "Courageous Congregation." But, first we need the courage to ask and then discuss difficult guestions.

So, here is one difficult question which our Clergy, Staff, Executive Committee, Board of Trustees and Congregation must consider: How do we balance our mandate and intention to welcome the stranger (*hachnasat orchim*) with providing security at our campus? As the Prophet Micah said: "They shall sit every person under their vine and under their fig tree, and none shall make them afraid" (Micah 4:4). We want our congregants and guests to feel both secure and welcome at Temple Israel.

To some extent, we do what the Prophet Jeremiah told us to do: we seek the peace of the city where we are located and pray for peace within it (Jeremiah 29:7). Our Temple seeks the peace of the city by having an open dialogue with our local police and by increasing our security on an as needed basis. Another way we seek peace is by having a security guard on our premises during services.

Not every element of security is welcoming and not every effort to be welcoming is secure. For example, we can add several more guards and have them more often, but that may scare people more than make them feel secure. On the other hand, we can open every door to visitors to be welcoming, but that may not make our staff and congregants feel very secure. As stated by Hamden, Connecticut temple administrator Jennifer Levin-Tavares, we must determine what is appropriate for our environment.¹

Our Congregation has an important role in both providing a welcoming atmosphere and creating a safe and secure environment for all who enter our doors. According to Ms. Levin-Tavares, adding several more greeters at our services (please see the Membership Committee report) has been utilized for the last few years with great success in other congregations adding both warmth and additional security. Please help add to our temple's warmth and security by becoming a greeter.

If you have security expertise or want to study this issue, please note that we are creating a Campus Security Committee which will report to Marty List, VP and Chief Development Officer. This committee will be responsible for making recommendations to the Executive Committee. Your participation is crucial to creating a representative balance between welcoming the stranger and providing security on our campus. Please contact Jennifer Green Baer to participate in this important new committee and help Temple Israel become a Courageous Congregation.

From the Rabbi

The "Forgotten Holiday" and Inviting Others To Learn About Temple Israel

Liberal Jews typically do not observe the holiday of *Tisha b'Av* (the 9th of the Hebrew month of Av). Some speculate that it is because it falls in the summer (typically July or August) when school is out, while others believe that the theology of the holiday does not match Reform Jewish theology. Why is this?

Tisha b'Av as a holiday commemorates the destruction of the Temple in both 586 BCE, as well as 70 CE, since it is believed that this was the day its destruction occurred (both times). As time went on, additional historic events became associated with the day as well, including the expulsion of the Jews from Spain in 1492 and the expulsion of Jews from England in 1290, as well as other calamity-filled events.

Since we as Reform Jews do not pray for the rebuilding of the Temple in a literal sense as traditional Jews do (especially since we do not want to reinstitute the sacrifices in the Temple), Reform synagogues have moved away from formally observing Tisha b'Av as a sacred day.

This year, however, we here at Temple Israel will be noting the holiday in a special way on Saturday, August 13, as we try to understand orthodox life in Israel as well as modern Israeli filmmaking with our third evening in our "Summer Jewish Film Festival." This special night will focus on short films from the Ma'ale Film School in Jerusalem. The first film, and the one connecting us to the holiday, is called "Eicha," which is about an orthodox teenager born on Tisha b'Av who is given the name "Eicha," the holy book read on Tisha b'Av, whose title means "Lamentations." Two additional short films will be shown and discussed that night as well. This event begins at 7:00 pm and is free and open to all, so please invite your friends.

August also brings us back to our full programming schedule, meaning that our Informal Summer Shabbat services will end in the middle of August when we return to the Kraft Sanctuary for our worship services. This year, because the High Holy Days are so "late" (Erev Rosh HaShanah begins on Sunday night, October 2), we will have opportunities for two Open Houses in addition to our fifth annual "ShaBaBeQue" and Open House on Friday, August 26.

We will have fun activities each evening to help our visitors get to know us...so make sure to invite your unaffiliated friends and neighbors to "try us on" so they can "see if we fit." An invitation from a friend is the number one way people try out a new religious institution, so please help us grow Temple Israel by reaching out to someone and inviting them to experience what our spiritual community has to offer!

My prayer for you as the end of summer approaches is that you may find new meaning in old customs that might be considered outdated or theologically inappropriate. May your heart be open to experiencing new approaches as we work our way towards the new year...and please remember my door is always open to assist you on your Jewish journey.

From the Educator

Innovative Learning Is a Temple Israel Hallmark - Help Tell Our Story!

Our school is growing – and with YOUR help, we can grow even more. Here's the story to share with your friends, colleagues, and neighbors – anyone who might be seeking something different than the traditional Sunday school program – OR – who might know someone who is.

Temple Israel offers multi-age classes, interactive, exploratory learning, and family experiences. These all contribute to make Temple Israel's learning for children and families unique to Palm Beach County.

The school's schedule also contributes to both its uniqueness and its family-friendly approach. School classes are in session 15 Sundays throughout the school year, from September through May (starting September 11). Beyond that, special programs move students and families from Jewish learning to Jewish living. Monthly family-focused *Shabbat* dinners allow all to learn and live Friday night rituals in real time. Decorating the sukkah together and then marking the start of the fall festival as a community brings focus to a holiday that is often missed in the contemporary rush of life. Last year's "Shoes for Kids" collection – developed and promoted by the kindergarten and first grade students – yielded 114 pairs of shoes for others.

Temple Israel's "Texts, not Textbooks" approach begins in the youngest grades where students explorations about holidays and Jewish life grow from stories read and questions raised. Older students use primary texts as a springboard to rich discussions and activities, all focused on helping them to see daily choices as opportunities for Jewish living.

While Hebrew learning happens at all grades, students begin coming mid-week in fourth grade. In these sessions, students learn how to decode ("sound out") the words of our prayers and then use this skill to begin to unpack and understand and build their own connection to Jewish liturgy and faith. Our goal is not for a child to have a bar or bat mitzvah, but rather to become a bar or bat mitzvah – a teen ready to more deeply engage with Jewish life.

WAIT, WAIT – THERE'S MORE... Temple Israel Launches Programs for the Youngest and their Parents!

Temple Israel is launching new programs this year for infants, toddlers, preschoolers and their parents. These new Sunday morning programs will be free and open to all raising young Jewish children, so please share this information with your friends with young children!

The first session of MazalTots, a playgroup for infants, toddlers, and their parents will be Sunday, October 9 from 9:45 - 11:00 am. This program will be facilitated by educator, musician, and Temple Israel member Carol Garrett. Circle Time with songs and movement will be a part of each session, along with free play for little ones. There will be time for parents to connect with each other and with Temple Israel's educator, Iris Koller, and Rabbi Cookie Lea Olshein.

Family Pre-K programs, for parents and their three-and-four-year-olds, will offer developmentally appropriate introductions to Jewish holidays and customs. Iris Koller, who has led family programming for many years, will facilitate these sessions. All will involve stories, crafts, songs and more, offering families ways to prepare for family celebrations at home. The first Family Pre-K Program on Sunday, September 25, will focus on Rosh HaShanah and Yom Kippur. Family Pre-K programs will meet from 10:00 – 11:30 am.






