Preparation and Change

From the Rabbi

Preparing Our Hearts (and Heads) for the High Holy Days ...

Fresh start. Clean slate. New beginnings. Any of these phrases sound appealing when considering any of the relationships in your life?

Sometimes, when I ask people if there is a relationship in their life that they would like to see improved, I sense a feeling of embarrassment in the pause before the answer. Sometimes, there is an estranged child or family member, other times it is a long-lost friend. There is a reluctance to address the problems in the relationship head-on and, instead, a distance grows from the discomfort. Understandably so, since it is often difficult to repair a relationship that has laid fallow for far too long.

On Tuesday night, August 22nd, we begin the month of *Elul*, the month preceding the Jewish New Year, *Rosh HaShanah*. This month is traditionally thought of as the prequel (or warm up) to the High Holy Days' season (*Erev Rosh HaShanah* begins on Wednesday, September 20th).

In Aramaic, the word "*Elul*" means to search, which is appropriate since it is the time when we begin the deep search within our hearts to examine our behavior and search for answers regarding how to repair the emotional scars within.

This *Elul*, we have several special opportunities to engage more deeply with the process of "*Cheshbon HaNefesh*," or taking an accounting of our soul. First, we will be using a special new *siddur* (prayer book) for *S'lichot* and the month of *Elul*, called "*Mishkan HaLev*," which means "Sanctuary of the Heart." Through this book our *Erev Shabbat* services, beginning August 25th, will help us hear the sounds of the HHDs liturgy more clearly, and help us do the introspective work to make true change within ourselves this year.

Second, we have our annual "HHDs Boot Camp," with two separate offerings. In particular this month, we hope you will attend our first session on Wednesday, August 16th, from 7:00-8:15pm, where we will be using a unique creative writing process to delve deeply into our discomfort about the themes of the season. We would like to see as many people as possible participate in this workshop as we hope that some of these writings will be included within our new experimental/experiential *Yom Kippur* Afternoon Service called, "*Hineini*," which means "Here I Am." (More information about this service will be found in your September *Koleynu*.)

Lastly, we hope you will consider attending (and perhaps invite a friend to attend) not only our 6th Annual "ShaBaBeQue and Open House," but also our "Taste of Judaism" course beginning August 23rd, which is a wonderful refresher before the High Holy Days. This six-hour basic Judaism course would be a great kick-start for anyone in advance of the HHDs season!

As we prepare ourselves to begin anew, may this season of self-examination be guided by intentionality and kindness, both to yourself and others. Please let me know if there is anything I can do to bring more meaning to your Jewish iourney.


President's Circle Update

COMMUNITY BREAK-THE-FAST

Once again, Temple Israel's Sisterhood is inviting you to a light Break-the-Fast following the final (Nilah) service on Yom Kippur. As always, juice and challah will be available to everyone, regardless of whether or not you choose to stay for the Break-the-Fast.

MEMBER SEATING

Seating is available to those members whose dues are current or have made special arrangements. Each adult member will receive a ticket in their name; tickets are not transferable. Children through age 25 are welcome to attend services with their family at no additional charge. If you have adult children, please encourage them to join Temple Israel in their own name.

ASSOCIATE & GUEST OF MEMBER SEATING

Guests of members are welcome to sit with the member family. Cost of tickets: out-of-county \$100 per adult per holy day or local \$125 per adult per holy day. Tickets for children ages 12-18 years are \$50 per child per holy day. Children under 12 are complimentary.

UNAFFILIATED SEATING

Tickets are available to unaffiliated visitors for \$125 per adult and \$50 for children ages 12-18 for each holy day. Children under 12 are complimentary.

RECIPROCAL SEATING

Visitors who reside out-of-town and are affiliated with a Reform congregation may request seating by having their home congregation mail or fax (561-833-0571) a "U.R.J. Courtesy Request for Reciprocal Tickets" form to the Temple office.

Reciprocal requests are honored for one year only.

Tickets will be mailed in September unless you indicate you would like them held for pickup.
