One of the biggest differences between liberal and traditional Jews is how we interpret the idea of “commandedness.” Because Reform Judaism teaches that we should follow the philosophy of “informed choice” as the basis for making ritual choices, we are often left with a deep divide philosophically and theologically between liberal and traditional/orthodox Jews.

Liberal Jews still are bound by obligation. Our obligation is to learn as much as we can about a particular Jewish philosophy/ritual/idea before making a conscious decision how we will act. Indeed, Reform Judaism is all about intentionality.

Because it celebrates the giving of the Ten Commandments, the holiday of *Shavuot* is a perfect time to study how Jewish philosophy and teachings respond to issues in our lives. This year, we will focus on [studying a](#) hot topic in the news: immigration.

As we have done for the past 5 years, Temple Israel will join together with Temple Emanu-El to celebrate *Erev Shavuot* on Saturday, May 19th. Alternating locations each year, this year we will have the opportunity to host TEPB’s clergy and members to create a community learning opportunity called, “We Were Strangers, Too: Jewish Views on Immigration.” The event will feature a complimentary dairy dinner at 7:00 .pm. (please RSVP to the Office by 5/15), followed by *Havdallah* and our program beginning at 7:45pm.

As you know, we are now in the midst of counting the *Omer*, the 49-day period between the second day of Passover and the holiday of *Shavuot*. Connecting our exodus narrative of liberation to that of God giving us the *Torah* (also called “the Law”) is powerful. It reminds us that even when we do not want to do something, we always have obligations. Always. Together, we will study our obligations to the stranger. Please invite your friends to this thought-provoking evening.

My prayer for you this month is that, during this period of counting the *Omer*, may you be inspired to learn something new about the possibilities Jewish ritual has to offer and may you find comfort and meaning in the rituals of your Judaism. As always, please let me know if I can be of assistance on your Jewish journey.

## Spotlight on Deanna Roos

**How long have you lived in Florida?

# Don Carter Annual Journal Honoree

When Don Carter moved to Palm Beach during the 1990s, the Jewish community was engaged in finding ways to create greater connections to Jewish life. “Jewish Continuity” and later “Jewish Renaissance and Renewal” became catch-phrases to describe this effort.

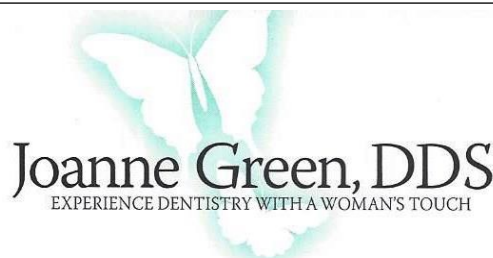
