# From the Rabbi

#### Celebrating Lifelong Jewish Learning –

The *Talmud* teaches us that formal Jewish education should begin at least by age 6 ... but it never puts a cap on the age when we should stop learning. In fact, the word "*Torah*" is often translated to mean "instruction", which means we should consider the *Torah*, and all our sacred literature, as an "instruction manual" for our lives.

Every spring we ask members of our congregation what opportunities for Jewish learning they would like Temple Israel to make available, sometimes formally and sometimes informally. This year, we are planning to be more formal once again, inviting our membership to attend one of two drop-in conversations on what you want/need in order to continue your Jewish education.

The first of these conversations will take place during the *Oneg Shabbat* dessert reception following our special "Education *Shabbat*" worship service on Friday, 5/10. (This is particularly appropriate since we will be celebrating our Religious School students year-long learning that night.) The second of these conversations will take place on Thursday, 5/23, at 7:30 p.m. To frame each discussion, we will begin with a text study on the importance of lifelong Jewish education.

Additionally, if you are unable to attend either of these facilitated conversations, I invite you to send me an email at Rabbi@Temple-Israel.com to let us know what topics you would like us to explore. In other words, we really want to hear what our congregation wants to learn so we can try our best to meet your needs.

Finally, we have had a wonderfully-committed group of adult learners this year living out these Jewish values through studying together with our Adult *B'nai Mitzvah*/Adult Confirmation Class. Everyone is invited to celebrate with Charlie Eaton, Carlos Escobar, Michell Escobar, Carol Garrett, Jim Garrett, Janice Rosenberg, and Alev Yalman on Friday, 5/17, during our evening worship at 6:30pm, and then again when they will each read from the *Torah* on Saturday, 5/18, at a special *Shabbat* morning service beginning at 10:30a.m. (Please note that, if you plan to attend the light *Kiddush* following Saturday morning's worship service, you must RSVP to the Office no later than Monday, 5/13, so the group can plan appropriately.)

One piece of being a member of a sacred community is that we must all recognize that each of us is on a sacred journey, and that we must support each other along the way. Sharing your needs and ideas regarding how best to continue your Jewish journey is one step you can take towards helping Temple Israel support you. Together, let's make a plan regarding setting some learning goals for next year. I look forward to being in conversation with you about where your Jewish journey might take you!

# The Mussar Moment Barry Horowitz, M.D.

A few weeks ago on a Sunday, there was a board retreat to discuss the short and long term goals for the Temple. It was a fantastic day and much was accomplished with near full attendance of the entire board. At one point, the facilitator asked us why we had come to participate. Don Carter answered: "I am on the board." His meaning was clear: he had a responsibility (*achrayut* in Hebrew) to the synagogue and his fellow board members to attend.

Rabbi Alter Henoch Leibowitz was the late *Rosh Yeshiva* of the Chofetz Chaim Yeshiva in Queens, N.Y., which his father had started in 1933. In 1941, when the younger Rabbi Leibowitz was still only in his early 20s, the untimely death of his father thrust him into the role of leading the yeshiva. He was unexpectedly cast into a position of responsibility and he embraced it, building the Chofetz Chaim into one of the foremost yeshivas in the world. This reveals a lot about his embodiment of the trait of responsibility.

But it is actually another story about Rabbi Leibowitz that is a more penetrating example of the trait of responsibility that was rooted in his heart. Rebbetzin Leibowitz did not want her husband to wash the dishes. Once she had to go to an appointment, and to ensure that he didn't clean the dishes, she put a note on the sink: "Please don't wash the dishes. There is a problem with the faucet." When she returned home, she found that Rabbi Leibowitz had moved the dishes into the bathroom and was washing them in the tub.

A person who has grasped the importance of responsibility and has implanted that trait in his or her heart will find opportunities to use it, whether on the large stage of fulfilling their life mission or in the mundane and menial tasks required in their home. It is a sign of real spiritual elevation for a person to take care of the small needs of the people around them because that attitude reflects humility and sensitivity, the crown jewels in real spiritual growth.

There is debate among scholars whether *achrayut* is derived from the Hebrew root *achar*, which means "after," or "*acher*," which means "other." In other words, is the essence of responsibility being concerned about what comes after (i.e., the consequences of one's actions) or to be sensitive to the other (i.e., attending to the needs of the people around you)?

The answer is both. The beauty and value of the trait of responsibility is the awareness it creates that everything we do has consequences and that those outcomes really matter, whether they play out over time or in the lives of other people. When that sensitivity is ingrained in your heart, it will affect the major decisions and actions you take where the consequences will be so glaringly obvious. But it will also show up in the tiny things you do, like washing the dishes or being alert to the feelings of others.

Indeed, it is one of the truest measures of our souls to demonstrate responsibility in every context, including the lives of the people who are closest to us.
