In a recent conversation with a member of our Executive Committee, I learned that we have succeeded with what we tried to create: entering Temple Israel creates a separation from the rest of the world and a period of time to "decompress" from the week. This is also what many of our congregants seek and this is what many of our congregants find at our synagogue.

We have created a beginning to this process of separation and decompressing on Shabbat through our Proneg prior to services. At our Proneg, we greet our congregants and visitors and everyone has an opportunity to have something to eat and drink and to meet or catch up with each other.

Some of the air is let out of the inflated balloon that is our week and we are then ready for our service.

We have a prayer in the beginning of our Shabbat service (Mishkan T'filah p.15):

WE ENTER THIS SANCTUARY...

which states what our Executive Committee member has found:

Weariness, doubt, the flaws within our human hearts.

The harshness of the week – let these drop away at the door.

In the brightness of Shabbat, let peace settle upon us as we lift our hearts in prayer.

In the middle of our service we pray that God will spur us to pursue Tikkun Olam:

DISTURB US, Adonai...

From "the quietude which arises from a shunning of the horror, the defeat, the bitterness and the poverty, physical and spiritual, of humans".

Make us know that the border of the sanctuary is not the border of living ... and its walls ... are not shelters from the winds of truth, justice and reality (at p. 55).

Towards the end of our service we read:

GIVE US A PLACE TO REST ...

which is a prayer for God to:

"Spread over us His shelter of peace" (at p. 61).

Our Temple may be a shelter of peace, but it is not a shelter "from the winds of truth, justice and reality" (at p. 55). Although we must be vigilant to guard against injustice, our synagogue is a place to feel differently from what we are bombarded with during the week. We come seeking peace, but, like we are directed to on Shabbat, we are not to spend our days in "torpor and slumber"; we are to be "stirred and spurred to action" (at p. 55).

So, at our synagogue we enter a different space and time but remain connected to our Temple community and our calling to engage in actions that will make our world a better place.

Come to Temple Israel and feel a sense of community, purpose and peace. Come to our services for moments of inspiration, transformation and celebration.

## The Stranger Blessing Us ...

In the old *S'lichot* (the holiday leading into the High Holy Days) prayer book, the opening passage talked about the leaves turning now that fall was arriving – living in the south, I laughed each time I read this, thinking about how different my autumn experience was. However, it was an important moment each year, in that it was a trigger to remind me about the change of seasons, even if I could not see any physical difference in my environment.

Here in south Florida, our biggest reminder of the change of seasons is the welcoming back of our part-year residents ... and so we say to our part-year residents, welcome (back) home, whether you are here in the Palm Beaches only for a couple of months or for "six months and a day." We believe you have much to contribute to our sacred community and invite your full participation, no matter how long you plan to be here this season. With that, please call the Office to set up a time to get together so we can get to know you better – coffee, tea, lunch, whatever is most convenient for you! (This offer also applies to our year-round residents!)

During "season," we also find an upswing in visitors to our congregation, which allows us to practice the *mitzvah* of *hachansat orchim* (welcoming the stranger). Remember how you felt the first time you walked into a synagogue (even this synagogue)? It was probably a little overwhelming unless you have an invitation from someone who was already a member. Please do reach out to the folks with the "blue mugs" whenever they are here (there is almost nothing worse for a Rabbi to hear than a visitor held a blue mug and still no one said hello).

We are fortunate that we are one of the few congregations actually growing over the past 5 years, and have been told that one of the reasons people join is because they were warmly welcomed their first visit. But saying hello is not enough. We then invite our guests and new members to participate in the many great things happening at Temple Israel and in our community. These new people are reaching out to their Jewish heritage and our beautiful traditions and, by welcoming them to our fold, we can invite them to help strengthen our Jewish community and build on all the great things happening here at Temple Israel.

Speaking of great things, we are excited that our first "Shabbat on Broadway" will take place on Friday, 11/3, at 6:30pm. The themes of our Shabbat prayers will be represented by songs from Broadway's best known musicals in addition to some of our prayers being sung to their melodies. (As a preview, if you join us, you might hear something from "A Chorus Line" and "Fiddler on the Roof," as well as "West Side Story," "Man of La Mancha," and even "Hamilton"!) Because of its outreach nature, this would be a great time to invite your friends to join you at Temple Israel ... as always, all are welcome.

Lastly, as we prepare to celebrate the secular holiday of Thanksgiving, please consider incorporating Jewish values into your celebration by inviting those who might not have a place to celebrate, making a food or gift card donation to our local Food Pantry or AJFCS, or perhaps sharing your leftovers (or, better yet, cooking something special) with the hungry the day after Thanksgiving (on Thanksgiving Day, there are many places someone can get a good meal, however, the need still exists the day after, and the day after that).

Even for those of us who might struggle, let us practice the Jewish value of giving thanks daily and count our many blessings this year. We each have been given so much, and we each have so much to give.

As I always say, my door is always open ... please let me know how I can assist you on your Jewish journey.





# The Mussar Journey Rabbi Howard Shapiro

Starting on Tuesday evening, November 7<sup>th</sup>, Dr. Barry Horowitz and I will begin a shared passage of introspection and learning using the principles of the 1,000 year old spiritual tradition we call *Mussar* in our tradition. This is an invitation and a small taste of what the journey/passage will look and feel like.

The word *Mussar* means "instruction" but that definition does not encompass what the experience is like. *Mussar* in the world of Jewish Spirituality is about looking inward and learning from yourself what "work" your "soul" is leading you to do so that you may become the best you can be. Or in traditional God language: *Mussar* asks you to listen to what God is teaching you and you listen by observing how you interact with what we call *Middot* or "soul traits".

So there are many soul traits". Humility is a soul trait; patience is a soul trait and so are faith, anger, trust, silence and I could go on. How do you learn from them? How patient are you at a red light? Did the car in front of you react to its turning green fast enough for you? What does *Mussar* say about your reaction? Is there a Jewish text or teaching that can be brought to bear on the situation and is there a *Mussar* practice that can help us appreciate the blessings and challenges we live with?

The "journey" is interactive. There is meditation; there is learning; there is sharing; there is a time to challenge and a time to accept; there is a time to know and a time to live in our unknowing.

If you are brand new to *Mussar* – you are welcome. If you are a *Mussar* veteran – come on back and refresh your practice. For everyone, there are wonderful resources to bring you up to speed on the Mussar Institute website. <a href="https://www.mussarinstitute.org">www.mussarinstitute.org</a>

# President's Circle Update





Philip Roth is often mentioned as the single most important author of the past 25 years.


Join us on Thursday, Nov. 16, as the Temple Israel Book Club explores this fascinating writer.


Each attendee will be asked to read and comment on one of Roth's books. Find your favorite passage and research how reviewers at the time reacted to its publication.




