From the Rabbi

Modim Anachnu Lach ... We Give Thanks to You ...

We are taught that being intentional about giving thanks is central to the practice of Judaism. We thank God for allowing us to wake up in the morning, before sleeping, and every time we eat (some say a blessing whenever they eat anything larger than the size of an olive). Jewish tradition asks us to become intentional about stopping to say thank you throughout our day, so we will take nothing for granted.

Too many of us understand that our time is short here on earth. We have seen friends and family with their lives cut short and, hopefully, each time we experience this, we recommit ourselves to making meaning in the days that remain for us. Regarding time, nothing is promised.

Then, we have to think about the things in our lives. Most of us have so much more than we ever imagined having, and so much more than we ever could really need. Therefore, the Sages teach us to share our bounty with those less fortunate. As we are taught during the High Holy Days, the prophet Isaiah asked the question, what is the fast that God desires? The answer is found in Isaiah 58:6-7, when we are taught: "No, this is the fast I [God] desire: To unlock the fetters of wickedness, and untie the cords of the yoke to let the oppressed go free; to break off every yoke. It is to share your bread with the hungry, and to take the wretched poor into your home; when you see the naked, to clothe him, and not to ignore your own kin."

These are powerful words as we approach the American holiday of Thanksgiving (which some say may have been modeled after *Sukkot*), as is it is not enough for us to say these three words found in our liturgy, "*modim anachnu lach*," (we give thanks to You). Isaiah is teaching us that God wants not only our words, but also our deeds. So how can Thanksgiving become more meaningful for your family this year?

Of course, you can start with making a food donation to the West Palm Beach Food Pantry. We will certainly be blessed with Thanksgiving meals and sharing our extra with someone in need can make our meal all the more meaningful.

But you could also decide to write a note of thanks to someone, or commit to volunteering as a way to show gratitude for and "give back" for all that you have. Perhaps you might get a small notebook and start a gratitude journal – even writing one thing a day that you are thankful for can help you be more aware of all that you have to be thankful for, rather than things you feel you are lacking. Truly, it is all about being aware and intentional so we can meet the recommended 100 blessings (i.e., thank you's) the Sages teach we should say every day.

To model this, I would like to say thank you to everyone who worked so hard to make this High Holy Days' season so special. Without the participation of so many members participating behind the scenes, our worship would not have been as meaningful. Thank you. I am humbled by all of you and how you give of yourselves to make Temple Israel a truly special place to belong.

May you all be blessed with an awareness of all that is good in your life, from the little things we take for granted to the grandest of blessings ... and may we all learn to share what we have with those less fortunate. This way, our blessings will continue to flow from generation to generation, not just to ourselves and our families, but to all of God's children.

Please know that my door is always open ... let me know how I can help you on your Jewish journey.

From the Executive Director

There are times when we have a life-changing event that compels us to re-focus our time and energy: when a medical situation urges us to slow down and diminish stress; when a loved one becomes ill and we re-prioritize our lives to become a caregiver; when a financial crisis strikes and we learn how to be more prudent or accept help. But too often it takes such a tragedy to cause us to re-evaluate our lives, *and that alone is the most tragic* – why do we continue in our routine ways and not examine our lives and ourselves from time to time?

During the High Holy Days, we are asked to reflect on our lives during the past year, to acknowledge our sins, to ask for forgiveness and to make a resolution not to repeat our transgressions. And yet unfortunately many of us neglect to take the next course of action to truly prevent the repeat of our wrongdoings.

To improve ourselves, we need to take a look at who we are and what we are capable of, we need to objectively look at our situations, we need to implement positive changes and we need to set and focus on realistic goals.

I have been the Temple Administrator and Executive Director at Temple Israel for barely four months now and have observed our Temple in action with a fresh eye. I have seen firsthand the intriguing programs we offer, the relevant social actions we undertake, the dynamic worship services we hold, the devotion of our Board and Committees, and the wonderful camaraderie amongst our congregation. But just as we should do as individuals, our Temple also needs to examine itself, to see how we can flourish further to serve our members and community as well as for our financial well-being. And while we continue to repair our foundation – evidenced in our new ballroom carpet, security cameras and sound system in our sanctuary – we need to further build on our foundation to better us all.

So what changes should we consider? We've started a new "TempleTots" Program to introduce young families to our synagogue and encourage the continuity of a Judaic education. We're looking at automating forms, payments and donations in a more user-friendly program. We are engaging professional services to devise a better marketing plan (and possibly to reduce some of our email blasts or make them more effective). We're putting together our "wish lists" as we contemplate next year's budget. And we're committed to increase our Membership as well as our Life & Legacy partners who will help ensure that Temple Israel's incredible programs and services are here for our next generation as well.

I hope that you join Temple Israel and me in taking time for self-reflection and implementing some positive changes. Wishing you and yours a very happy, healthy and prosperous new year!

Temple Israel Travels

On Sunday, September 15, Temple Israel travelled to the Holocaust Documentation and Education Center in Dania Beach to see our temple member Mark Cohen's exhibition "A Legacy to Remember." After a delicious bagel breakfast at the temple, over 30 TI members boarded a bus accompanied by Rabbi Olshein, as well as Rabbi and Eileen Shapiro, who led discussions on the way down and back.

The Center was founded in 1980 and moved into its new space in 2016, and its "...mission is to document and present an enduring, historically accurate record of the Holocaust through eyewitness accounts..." We were greeted by its President, Rositta Keningsberg, in the large main space that has the only rail car in the United States used to transport Jews to concentration camps in Poland, as well as a Sherman Tank which liberated Jews from Dachau, symbols of despair and triumph.

After watching a film where Mark spoke about his background as an artist, the exhibition and his process in creating it, he led us on a very personal tour. The reality and horror of various aspects of the Holocaust were depicted in moving and provocative ways. It was fascinating to hear Mark's emotions and motivations behind each work, which are quite large, were painted on raw canvas

and were unframed so as not to give any dignity to the subject matter. This, along with portraits of many survivors, allowed the group to transcend the difficult subject matter and come away with a sense of hope and life.

The Mussar Moment

Who/who Shall I Say Is Calling?

I am missing Leonard Cohen ^{z'l}. Not that I knew him; not that I even said a word to him except in my mind; not that I ever met him except in concert. But his words spoke to me – his words in poetry and in song even when I didn't get every reference. This time of year, I gravitate to "Who by Fire", his modern uptake of the prayer we call "*Unetaneh Tokef*", which our newest Reform High Holy Day prayer books translates:

"Let us proclaim the power of this day – a day whose holiness awakens deepest awe.... You inscribe and seal. You record and recount. You remember all that we have forgotten. And when You open the Book of Memories it speaks for itself – for every human hand leaves its mark and imprint like no other...."

Leonard's poem/song picks up when our prayer morphs into a series of questions set into an image box that begins with the words: "On *Rosh HaShanah* this is written; on the Fast of *Yom Kippur* this is sealed: How many will pass away from this world, how many will be born into it? He asks: "Who by fire? Who by water? Who in the sunshine?.... And **Who/who** shall I say is calling?"

I struggle with this poem/prayer. When I study Mussar, I tend to understand that the One who is calling is the personification of my deeds. The prayer book reads, "Every human hand leaves it mark..." It is not some personalized God looking over me writing in a spiral notebook with indelible ink. It is every time I have spoken and acted out of love and every time I have not. It is every good deed and every misdeed. It is the ripples I make as I walked the path of this past year.

It is good to engage in this struggle. The art of *Mussar* teaches that the very act of questioning, struggling, examining can get us in touch with our deeper self. It can help us walk a path of the righteous as we begin a New Year and new opportunity to be a blessing.




