We could not begin this article without giving "Thanks" to everyone who worked tirelessly to make this New Year so wonderful at Temple Israel; to Rabbi Olshein for her dedication to making this High Holy Day season the best for us all; Cantor Kruk for his beautiful voice and songs that made our worship so special; to David Block for his lovely music that ties it all together; to our dedicated staff: Clover, Tamekia and Earnton, headed by our Temple Administrator, Jennifer Green Baer, for your efforts without which things would never get done; to the Choir for their voices that lift our worship services even higher; and to each and every Volunteer who assisted in the mailings, sold ads and proofed our Annual Journal, served as an usher, attended one more meeting, organized the Honors or folded one more piece of paper or cooked one more kugel ... thank you, thank you. It is truly this community that makes Temple Israel the best of the best!

So where are your presidents in all of this? We always have three duties:

- **The Duty of Care** We have to ensure the prudent use of all assets, including the facility, the people and good will.
- **The Duty of Loyalty** We have to ensure that Temple Israel's activities and transactions are, first and foremost advancing its mission.
- The Duty of Obedience We have to ensure that Temple Israel obeys applicable laws and regulations and follows its own by-laws.

These presidential obligations never change even when our board changes and the gavel is passed to the next president. What does change is the "everything else", the details of Temple life. They change sometimes daily, sometimes minute-to-minute. It's tending to the "everything else" in light of our duties that keep us so busy. We don't want to get waylaid on our way to our goal. We want to keep moving forward without any detours. Since no GPS exists to guide us, we are searching for direction from you in the form of small "Listening Sessions" at congregants' homes.

Congregants who have chosen to be facilitators have been charged with bringing together small, diverse groups of congregants for a conversation. The diversity may be determined by geography, or by age, or by interests or by whatever criteria the facilitator chooses. The groups will be comprised of 5 - 8 family units. The conversations are meant to last one hour or so. During each session "big picture" questions will be asked, as the basis for the conversation:

What brought you to Temple Israel and what makes you come back?

- What could be added to your Temple Israel experience that would make our Temple more indispensable to you?
- What needs do you think you will have in 5-10 years that could be met by Temple Israel?

By the time this article is published, we hope to have had 4-5 separate sessions at different locations. Our goal is to have about 15-20 sessions in total. We will record the thoughts expressed at each session, anonymously. It is impossible to reach everyone at Temple through these small groups, so let us know if you want to participate in a session and we will arrange it. At the conclusion of all the sessions, we will have one final session for everyone to attend. It will be at Temple on a future date and time. Finally, any meaningful information gathered during these sessions will be shared with you.

We send our wishes for a Happy, Healthy Sweet New Year to everyone.

The Mussar Moment

Everything that is alive grows. The *Mussar* strand of Jewish tradition speaks to how we grow and what tools we can use to grow towards the light. *Mussar* recognizes that growth is linear and that growing spiritually is hard. For those in our community who have studied *Mussar* in the past, and for those who would like to begin to explore this 1000-year-old Jewish spiritual perspective, Rabbi Shapiro and I invite you to participate this year's *Mussar* Class, *Mussar* and Your Voice for Growth, to keep your life's journey toward holiness and wholeness feeling new, fresh and compelling.

Using modern literature (poetry and prose) connected to relevant *middot* (soul traits), we will share the stories of our challenges and opportunities as we feel the hand of the ancient *Mussar* masters touching us, guiding us and giving us reason to begin again. We will utilize a variety of *Mussar* techniques including meditation, *kabbalot*, visualizations and contemplations. These insights into our behavior from our *Mussar* teachers assist us in addressing how we live our daily lives ethically, morally and in the spirit of the sacred. Spiritual and educational resources for this course will be provided in part each month from the *Mussar* Institute.

The class will take place at TI on the following evenings from 7:00 to 8:30 p.m.: November 14, December 4, 2018 and January 15, February 12, March 13, April 10, 2019.
