# Israel, Anyone?



"The air of Jerusalem is thick with prayers." I have always loved those words by the late, lamented Israeli poet, Yehuda Amichai. I would add to that: "thick with discussion." Israel, especially after its contentious elections, is a very noisy place.

I want to introduce you to that noise, and to that love.

At the request of several of our congregants, I have begun to explore the possibility of an Israel trip for Temple Israel – late June 2023. I have begun the conversation with J2 (J Squared) Adventures, which has become one of the most creative and engaged tour operators for Israel and Jewish-oriented travel.

This will not be your usual Israel trip. First, it will be shorter than usual – a week to ten days. Second, it will focus on the three Cs – culture, cuisine, and, of course, the conflict (or rather, the conflicts). We will meet with Israeli personalities, thought leaders, and interesting people. Third, it will be an easier-going experience than other Israel trips, with less strenuous walking.

The dates? Approximately June 18-28 – and I stress approximately. Final arrangements are in flux. The costs? Also in flux, but we would be staying at great hotels – in Jerusalem, Tel Aviv, and the North.

Next month she will be speaking of how Hanukkah is celebrated in Israel. We look forward to working with Tom on additional programs this year.

The first night of Hanukkah is December 18<sup>th</sup>. Our Brotherhood will be sending Hanukkah candles to all of our members and we hope you light the candles with your family, reading the prayers on the candles' box. We also hope you join us at our annual **Night of 100 Menorahs on Friday**, **December 23<sup>rd</sup>, starting at 6pm**. Dinner with *latkes* and *soufganyot* follow services which includes an illuminating candle-lighting, so please be sure to "BYOCC" – bring your own candles and *chanukkiah* (menorah) – and RSVP beforehand. This is a wonderful family celebration!

Our next **Family Shabbat is Friday, December 2**<sup>nd</sup> **at 5:30pm**, in person and livestreamed/saved to our Facebook page. Music, stories, an interactive service – what a wonderful experience for our children... and parents enjoy it too! We hope to see you there.

# The *Mussar* Moment

Mussar is all about people. It is about how people react to life situations as critical as our relationships with those we love and as trivial as grocery shopping. It is applied ethics. So, in our Mussar class for this year, Dr. Horowitz and I decided to concentrate on people. And since there is no Judaism without some nod to Torah, the people we will put on center stage are our Biblical personalities.

Notice I didn't say heroes. What I find amazing about the stories Torah decided to preserve is how imperfect our ancestors were. Well, that's really not a fair description. The sentence could just as easily have read, "how human our ancestors were". How they struggled to do what is right and how they succeeded and failed, failed and succeeded. They are us.

The Mussar masters give us a framework in which we are called upon to examine ourselves and the ways we relate to the world we have been gifted. Yes: gifted; life is a gift. Every morning you see the sun rise or light emerge from darkness you are blessed. And a foundational Mussar belief builds upon appreciating the presence of that present. That means connecting with gratitude. That means seeing the world with eyes that are willing to view both that which is whole and that which is cracked as opportunities to do good or do better or take an inner smile and learn for tomorrow.

Mussar teaches that you and I have the ability to be more. It does not accept the idea that we are who we are or it is what it is. We are in constant becoming; life is a process verb. And every encounter with people, places, and things is an opportunity to grow. That's what the Torah stories are all about. People who face the challenges and gifts of life and climb. In Mussar language, they reach for holiness. Do they (do we) always succeed? That's our Mussar exploration. Join us.

A family heirloom, a memento from Israel, a housewarming gift... many of our *chanukiyot* have special sentimental value. We asked our members for photos and the story behind their menorahs:



From Sherri Gilbert: Among my menorahs is this "tree of life" themed one that I received many years ago from a non-Jewish friend for whom I was probably one of the few Jewish people she had ever known when we met. (Possibly the only one, and possibly still her only Jewish friend.) That was pretty much the case with me starting from early childhood, so even though Jewish culture has crept more into society at large these days, I always appreciated the friends through the years who went out of their way to find a Chanukah or Passover card for me instead of sending a Christmas or Easter card at those holidays that often overlapped. So it was especially touching to receive this beautiful menorah from one of them, a symbol of our friendship, which always includes finding common ground and learning from each other.

From Beryle Goverman: I cherish this menorah as a remembrance of my dear late husband Jeffrey who became a bar mitzvah with this when he was 13 years old. As I light the candles each year, I think of the many happy Chanukahs we had together.





From Karen Szteinberg: My sister gave me a beautiful modern menorah from Israel as a wedding gift. I loved how the moveable branches could be assembled in different ways – straight, arc-shape or circular. While I still adore and use that menorah, I was gifted the pictured "Matriarch Menorah" by my former employer when I left New York, a symbol of the love my work family had for me (he referred to me as "Eshet Chayil", a woman of valor, quoting "for her price is far above rubies.") I now cherish and use both as they represent my two lives (personal and work.)




