The following pages include a schedule and descriptions of Temple Israel's programs and services leading up to and following these Days of Awe. Whether you are a long-time congregant or new to our community, we welcome you.

Tickets will be required for our Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur services, which are free for our Temple Israel members in good standing and at a reasonable cost for non-members. **Members and non-members must register by August 31**st to obtain tickets – either online at <u>www.temple-israel.com/hhd2023</u> or by using the enclosed Ticket Order Form. You will need to show your tickets at our door to proceed to services.

Services will be held in our Morris & Rose Kraft Sanctuary. We anticipate a full house as we are all excited to partake in our new rabbis' first High Holy Days services with us. Should we exceed our sanctuary's capacity, our David & Pauline Carter Ballroom will be available with livestreamed services. For those unable to attend in person, services will be livestreamed to our Facebook page (Temple Israel, West Palm Beach).

One of Temple Israel's special traditions is to recognize our members and honor them with the opportunity to participate in our High Holy Days' services. Yizkor ("remembrance") is a special memorial service in which we remember our loved ones who died in the last year, along with those who died in years past. The final service on Yom Kippur features the opportunity to come up onto the bimah together for concluding prayer, Havdalah and the final shofar blast.

MEMBER TICKETS

Tickets are available at no cost to Temple Israel members whose annual financial commitment has been paid, or who are on a payment plan or have made special arrangements in advance. Registration either online or via the Ticket Order Form must be submitted in order to attend services. Each member will receive a ticket with his or her name; tickets are non-transferable. Children through age 25 are welcome to attend services with their family at no additional charge but they also must have a ticket. If you have adult children over 25 years old, please encourage them to join Temple Israel. Membership is free for those 30 years old and under, and is guite reasonable to those older.

GUEST TICKETS

Guests of members are welcome. Cost of tickets: \$100 per out-of-county adult per holy day or \$125 per local adult per holy day. Tickets for children ages 12-18 years are \$50 per child per holy day. Children under 12, college students and active military are complimentary. Please submit the names of guests with the member registration in order to receive tickets for attendance.

NON-MEMBER TICKETS

Tickets are available to unaffiliated visitors for \$125 per adult per holy day and \$50 for each child ages 12-18 per holy day. Children under 12, college students and active military are complimentary. Seats are limited so please submit the online registration or Ticket Order Form as soon as possible in order to receive tickets for attendance.

RECIPROCAL TICKETS

Visitors who reside out-of-town and are affiliated with a Reform congregation may request complimentary seating by having their home congregation send a "URJ Courtesy Request for Reciprocal Tickets" form to Temple Israel in advance.

Please submit the online registration or Ticket Order Form in order to receive tickets for attendance. Deadline to submit ticket requests is August 31.

TALLITOT

The Temple has a limited supply of *tallitot* available for use. A *tallit* is normally worn during daytime services only; the exception is *Kol Nidre* night, when it is also customary to wear one.

USHERS

Members may indicate on their registration if they would like to be an usher during one of our services – a wonderful way to meet new people! Ushers will be on-site to assist throughout the day, identified by a white carnation on their lapel.

COMMUNITY BREAK-THE-FAST

Temple Israel's Sisterhood and Brotherhood are partially sponsoring our Break-the-Fast after the final (*N'ilah*) service on *Yom Kippur*. To RSVP or for more info, please refer to our flyer or contact our Temple Office. **RSVPs must be received by September 18th.**

DEDICATIONS

To honor or memorialize loved ones, please consider sponsoring *bimah* arrangements, dedicating a sacred book, making a donation to offset the cost of our Book of Memory, or designating your Annual Appeal gift in their honor. Forms are available on our website or through our office.

PARKING

In addition to our parking lot on Pine Street (*accessible only from Dixie Highway*), valet parking will be available. Our porte-cochère is available for drop-off/pick-up but vehicles cannot idle or remain there.

BOOK OF MEMORY

Our Book of Memory containing members' yahrzeits and all those with memorial plaques will be available prior to Kol Nidre services and distributed to members at that time. Within its pages are meaningful readings and prayers that can be used throughout the year. (Members, kindly reply to our Yahrzeit Verification letter in a timely manner.)

LIVESTREAMING

Services will be available on our Facebook page (Temple Israel, West Palm Beach).

OUR FAMILY EXPERIENCE SERVICES designed for those with younger children are at no cost but we do request advanced registration for these services as well.

Tickets will be mailed in early September. Upon arriving at Temple, you will need to show your tickets at the door to receive your name tag and enter the Morris & Rose Kraft Sanctuary. Please plan to arrive early. Check-in will be in the David & Pauline Carter Ballroom.

As always, there is open seating; however, space is limited in the Kraft Sanctuary and our overflow seating will be in the Carter Ballroom where our service will be streaming live.
