From our President Charlie Eaton. Co-President

July is here. Traditionally, the December-January transition is the brightest highlight of the secular calendar, but in many ways, the shift from June to July has a greater impact. July 1 starts the financial year for many organizations. It's the scariest day of the year for hospitals as the wave of new interns, fresh out of medical school, start their first day as doctors. In past years, July 1 was the date the first TV commercial aired, the first US postage stamps were issued, the first publication of a photograph in a newspaper appeared, the IRS was established, Zip Codes were inaugurated, and Medicare went into effect. Big stuff.

July 1 also marks a profound, exciting, and bittersweet change for Temple Israel. Rabbi Jeffrey Salkin guided us as our Interim Rabbi through a challenging three years period of descent into and recovery from COVID. We have been immensely fortunate for his teachings and spiritual leadership. July 1 is also Temple Israel's transition to new teachers and spiritual leaders: Rabbis Carlie and Ryan Daniels. In short, Rabbi Ryan Daniels was the Associate Rabbi at North Shore Congregation Israel in Glencoe, Illinois, where he has served for the last seven years. Rabbi Carlie Daniels was the Acting Senior Rabbi at Temple Sukkat Shalom in Wilmette, Illinois, where she has served for the last six years. They have a young family and represent the demographic of congregants we need to bring to Temple Israel.

The goal for Temple Israel is a smooth passage. Rabbis Daniels have been in full preparation mode since January when they signed their contracts with Temple Israel. Since then, they've had countless Zoom meetings, phone calls, and correspondences with Temple Israel's congregants, clergy, staff, and lay leadership along with our area's other religious and secular leaders. They have plans underway for our traditional Temple events, the High Holy Days in September, and new programs and events to enrich and enlarge our congregation. They are poised to hit the ground running and lead us as Temple Israel blossoms.

This is a transformative time for Temple Israel as we aim to not only re-envision, rebuild and grow our temple but also to create a Jewish Cultural Center of the Palm Beaches. Strong partnerships with the Jewish Federation of Palm Beach County, Mandel JCC and others – as well as tenacious clergy and lay leadership – will enable us to provide educational, cultural, and religious programming for our extended community. Rabbis Daniels' visions align with ours, and their talents and experiences are exactly what we need to make our dreams a reality. I can't wait to see the future unfold.

From the Executive Director Karen Szteinberg



During my tenure at Temple Israel, I've heard many of our members' stories – how they came to temple, who their religious school teacher was, how the campus looked years ago, descriptions of their own bar/bat mitzvah or wedding here... such wonderful memories. Our members have also shared with me old photos and many have been brought to life – pictures of former rabbis, congregants, *simchas* and more.

I think back to my own childhood temples. In Brooklyn, we attended East New York Jewish Center every Shabbat; Rabbi Brilliant was a young, blond, blue-eyed rabbi who stood out in both his appearance and the manner in which he identified with the children. He made us feel that we were part of the congregation. Before that, I attended nursery school at Bnai Israel nearby, where I recall Rabbi German visiting our class to recite the prayers as we enjoyed TamTam crackers and grape juice every Friday. Such wonderful memories.

Unfortunately, memories of my Staten Island synagogue are slim. It was further away, everything was in Hebrew, and the men and women were separated. I recall the grandeur of the building, the hard pews of the sanctuary and the hushes in the hallways. We attended for about four years and I never felt any connection.

Moving to Long Island, we became active members of Temple Israel of South Merrick. My father was on committees, our names were on the walls, my friends and I walked together to attend the High Holy Days, I attended Purim and fundraisers and even Karate class there... it was our home temple. I was married at Temple Israel and my daughters were named there and had their bat mitzvahs there. Rabbi Thall was our rabbi, a towering man who was straightforward and not always appreciated; I related more to Cantor Bauer. Later on, Rabbi Simckes was our rabbi. He dressed as Megillah Gorilla at Purim. His sermons were interesting and he always invited children onto the bimah. I smile thinking about all the good times there.

My Jewish history, my Jewish education, my Jewish involvement... these are all part of who I am. Belonging to a temple and being part of synagogue life are strong threads in the tapestry of my life.

Just as our previous Temple Israel of West Palm Beach clergy have had a profound influence on our congregation and future, I now look forward to Rabbis Daniels interweaving their colorful threads to my tapestry, the essence of my very being.

Please join me in welcoming Rabbi Carlie Daniels and Rabbi Ryan Daniels, partake in all that Temple Israel offers, cherish your time at our programs and services, and feel the difference that a synagogue can make in your life. And may you always continue to weave your own tapestry.

The month of July signifies many things–the beginning of a new fiscal year, the first full month of summer and for many clergy it is a time of transition and/or new beginnings–leaving a pulpit, renewing their commitment to their current pulpit or beginning a new pulpit.

We thank Rabbi Salkin for his tenure as our Interim Rabbi and welcome Rabbi Carlie Weisbrod Daniels and Rabbi Ryan Daniels as our new Co-Senior Rabbis. Such an exciting time as we celebrate our centennial birthday and plan and vision our next 100 years.

Our first *Torah* Study with Rabbis Carlie and Ryan Daniels will be Saturday, July 1st with *Chukat/Balak*–double portion. In *parashah Balak*, Numbers 24:5, we receive the famous blessing: (Mah tovu ohalecha Yaakov mish'k'notecha Yisrael), How fair are your tents, O Jacob, your dwellings, O Israel. King *Balak* hired *Balaam* to curse the Jewish people and instead of cursing us, *Balaam* blessed us. We recite this blessing each morning. Many recite it as they pass a synagogue and before entering one.

l love singing and praying Ellen Allard's <u>Mah tovu</u> with our students during *T'filah* on Sunday mornings in our sanctuary. Not only because it's an opportunity to reinforce this *Torah* verse and teaching, it's an opportunity to reinforce our original mission as Jews to be a blessing...to ourselves, each other and the world... beathing, walking, talking, singing blessings. Ellen's <u>Mah tovu</u> is in one of my favorite languages, Hebrish–Hebrew and English. We begin singing in English and blessing all the people in the world with the following words "To all the people in the world (clap, clap) I bless you with peace (clap, clap). To all the people in the world (clap, clap) for now and for evermore. To all the people in the world (clap, clap) I bless you with peace for now and evermore." This is followed by the chorus with the blessing we find in Numbers 24:5, אַרָאָר מִשְׁכָנָתֵיך יִשְׁלֶב מִשְׁכְנָתֵיך יִשְׁלֶב מִשְׁכְנָתֵיך יִשְׁלֶב מִשְׁכְנָתֵיך יַשְׁלֶב מִשְׁכְנַתָּיך יַשְׁלֶב מִשְׁכְנַתָּיך or song, students embrace the opportunity to add another blessing for each verse. Their eagerness, joy and smiles as they pray this song is contagious, uplifting, energizing and fills me with hope for our present and future.

Nu, why am I thinking/writing about blessings? *Acha*, you know it's not just because of the *Torah* portion. Yes, it's part of my daily walk and always on my mind. How am I a blessing? Was I a blessing in that moment? How are you a blessing... to yourself and the world? What are your blessings for Rabbi Salkin, our congregation and Rabbis Carlie and Ryan Daniels as we embrace and begin our journey together? Please say these blessings, write them, share them, walk them, be them and yes, sing them.

May we all be blessed with and walk in אָהֲבָה (love), שָׁמְחָה (joy), דֶסָד (kindness), יוֹשֶׁר (honesty), (courage), יוֹשֶׁר (larity), אָמִינָה (faith) and הַפּאֶרֶת beauty) as we continue to go and grow from strength to strength embracing and blessing this sacred moment in and on our journey together. חזק חזק ונתחזק (*Chazak, Chazak v'nitchazeik*) – Be strong, be strong and together we will strengthen one another!



The Mussar Moment Barry Horowitz, M.D.

At the end of April we took a wonderful trip to Amsterdam. After several days of beautiful tulips, incredible art and other amazing sites, we had arranged with our hotel to have a rental car delivered at 8:30 am so that we could drive to Normandy. The time of delivery came and went and I asked the concierge to find out what the delay was. She assured me that everything would be fine and indeed the car came a bit after 9:00 as the rental company thought the delivery time was actually 9:30. All was well and we departed.

But internally, in the time when we did not know what was happening with the car, all was not well. I became impatient and frustrated as the terrific hotel staff tried to contact the rental car company and figure out what was going on. My emotions and negative thoughts got the better of me and it did not feel good at all.

Our lives are taking place within great cycles of time, space and material, even though we often have our eyes focused so directly on the moment's pleasure or pain that we don't perceive the truth of that largest picture. We truthfully have so little control over so many features of our lives, including both our abilities and the circumstances that we face, that it makes no sense to put ourselves through useless suffering as if we did have control. And that's just what we do when we slip into impatience. This mistaken worldview affects our attitude towards our growth as well. We forget that everything is not in our control and that we can only achieve according to our abilities and the circumstances that we face, we are better off to be patient—patient with the things that are within our control to change and to achieve, and patient with those things that aren't.

Understanding that difficult tests are the nature of life is the first step in achieving the inner balance that we seek. The Mussar sources refer to this balanced state of mind and being as "menuchat ha'nefesh," which translates as a "calmness of the soul." The way to cultivate this state is to develop a rich inner world, by learning to be at peace with what surrounds us, at peace with ourselves, and at peace with our Creator. When we come to appreciate that many things are beyond our control and that even negative things that happen have merit, for they allow us the opportunity to stretch ourselves in growth, we become at peace with our environment. We come to peace with ourselves by controlling our negative impulses and working to achieve an inner balance. Of course, nothing here is easy. The tension of the ongoing struggle remains and cannot be avoided. Embracing the struggle is all that we can do, and we do that through practice.


Also for the new year, the Sisterhood and Brotherhood will be sponsoring in part our **Break-the-Fast** with delicious food catered by Egle's Catering.

There are various funds you may contribute to at Temple Israel. Below is how the money for each fund is used, not only to help Temple Israel thrive but also help the greater Palm Beach County community.


