Season of New Beginnings

This is a season of new beginnings. For us personally, we are still unpacking boxes at home and in the office, beginning what we pray will be a long, prosperous career at Temple Israel. For students and teachers, August is the start of the academic year. This month others have welcomed new children or grandchildren, celebrated weddings and marked any number of other new beginnings.

For the broader Jewish community, Friday, August 18th is Rosh Chodesh Elul, the beginning of the Hebrew month just prior to Rosh Hashanah and the Jewish New Year. Traditionally, this is a month to prepare ourselves spiritually for the High Holy Day season of renewal. Our Sages taught that every person should prepare themself for thirty days before Rosh Hashanah with repentance, prayer and charity. Humbling and awesome spiritual work, because, well, we're talking about the Days of Awe.

For many, that grand messaging and even the music and majesty of the High Holy Days could feel overwhelming. Because our inboxes are full and we're always torn by our many obligations at work, home and elsewhere. There is always too much to do, too many tasks to accomplish, and too little time to complete them. Who has the bandwidth these days for *extra* introspection, prayer and charity?

From that mindset, it is easy to simply not engage in this season's soul-work at all. But we know if we don't put in the work, we probably shouldn't expect the spiritual returns that are possible when we do. As we read in Mishnah, "according to the labor is the reward" (*Pirkei Avot 5:23*). So, many of us find ourselves this month in that spiraling, chicken-and-egg conundrum: It is easier to avoid doing the introspection and *teshuvah* work, but without putting in the effort we also can't expect to feel fully transformed after Yom Kippur.

It is precisely that all-or-nothing mindset that is the problem. Most often, the messaging around Elul and the Days of Awe that follow leaves off the part that transitions and new beginnings are never simple or easy. The truth is, when it comes to the High Holy Days, there is no magical light switch that—*POOF!*—makes us feel transformed or cleansed or healed. No, *teshuvah* is a process. In no other aspect of our lives does a transition mean a sudden leaving what was and having a totally clean slate, nor do our feelings in life's liminal moments ever fit neatly within the binary of comfortable or uncomfortable, simple or complicated, good or bad. Rather, we live in a world of both-and rather than either-or. This is true of our Elul-work as well.

This is a season of new beginnings: A time to prepare ourselves spiritually for the High Holy Day season of renewal, possible only when we show up and tap into the toolbox of rituals—self-reflection, prayer and charitable giving—which are available to us. Let us not be overwhelmed by the work, nor naïve enough to think this season's transformation will come effortlessly or quickly. Rather, may our journey through Elul and the Days of Awe be full and bring us back to what is actually always already present in us, if only we would allow ourselves to uncover it.

Charlie Eaton, Co-President


It's been less than six months since I officially became co-president of Temple Israel. It feels like much longer – in a good way! Temple members have ramped up their engagement in Temple activity planning. New members have stepped up to join and reinvigorate committees. The membership committee has grown and become the central hub of outreach event planning and coordination. An enthusiastic strategic planning committee was formed, identified marketing as an underserved need, developed additional outreach channels for Rabbis Daniels' first Shabbat service, and decided to hold off until our Rabbis have settled in enough to help guide the strategic planning process. Our office has completed the long process of migrating records to ShulCloud management and is rolling out new capabilities like registering and paying for High Holy Days services online

At the time of this writing, it's also been less than one month since Rabbi Ryan Daniels and Rabbi Carlie Daniels officially became Temple Israel's Rabbis. It feels like a brand-new day. There is a buzz in the air, greater attendance at services, and although I didn't think it possible, our congregants and staff seem even happier than usual. Our Rabbis have begun the process of meeting every one of our members in person, working closely with our staff and lay leadership planning the future and solving problems of the past.

Some of this is the honeymoon phase, but even more, this is the overall excitement of Temple Israel's transformation – offering new activities, engaging our local community, and expanding our membership. Three big Temple events are coming up – Temple Israel's Open House and fantastic Brotherhood ShaBaBeQue with special activities for young and old on August 18th, the High Holy Days season stretching from September 9th to October 7th, and our Centennial celebration on November 11th. Each will bring something new, bridging our past and our future. Our Rabbis have updated our videoconferencing tech to improve the experience of blended board meetings and weekly Torah study. It's remarkable – come to Torah study and see for yourself. We are all on a journey of remarkable change, and Marty and I are grateful to be on this path with you.

Embracing אֱלוּל (Elul)

This month we welcome in אֱלוּל (*Elul*). The final month of 5783. An entire month to prepare for the new year, 5784, and an opportunity to lovingly review this past year. Another "Sanctuary of time" as we sing at Musical *Kabbalat* Shabbat Services beginning the transition from the work week into the gift, *mitzvah* of Shabbat.

A Sanctuary of time a space for us to repair.

The events to leave behind a space for us to repair.

Let us enter, boachem l'shalom.

These words of Rabbi Jonathan Aaron set to music so beautifully by Elana Arian in honor of his 25th year at Temple Emanuel in Hollywood, CA might also help us as we lovingly embrace this month of introspection.

It is said אֲלוּל is an acronym from the Song of Songs, 6:3, אֲנִי לְדוֹדִי וְדוֹדִי וְדוֹדִי לְחֹוֹל (Ani L'dodi V'dodi Li') – I am my beloved and my beloved is mine. Again, we are reminded that we are all created b'tzelem Elohim, in the image of G-d, as many translate beloved to our relationship with G-d, the G-d that resides within every one of us, and lovingly embrace this time to discover, restore and recommit our relationship with G-d, ourselves and others. How do we develop, mend, repair, renew this connection with ourselves, others, our community, the world? Might this also provide us with an opportunity for self-care as we find time to pause, breathe, be each day as we take time to review the past year remembering moments, events, experiences? Formulating how we will reset, welcome in and walk in the new year 5784?

Many find journaling to be helpful. Writing a few minutes at the beginning and/or end of each day as a tool for our own personal expression, a way of honoring our emotions and sorting through our thoughts and feelings. Our journaling might include challenges we overcame, things we wish we'd done differently, people we may reach out to ask forgiveness, goals and intentions for the new year.

Psalm 27 is another suggested daily tool for our work. Chave Mirel's setting of verse 4,

Metaphorically Speaking

I loved Rabbi Shapiro's blog "A Garden is a Place of Worship". He talked about his own personal garden at his home. He touched lightly on the power of growth. So, Rabbi Shapiro, I'm going to piggyback on your blog.

In my case, the "garden" is the Religious School. Rabbi Shapiro said in regard to his garden, "It takes a lot of patience and it also takes a lot of care." Stepping in mid-way through the Religious School year taught me that it sure does take a lot of patience to reassure the parents and students that we have a great school despite the year's staff and curriculum changes. And that changes bring opportunities, and we can make our school even better.

As part of our school curriculum, we are going to be engaging the kids in a lot of Tikkun Olam, repairing the world. What the kids today see as growth are the tall towers going up all around our area. Beautiful land expanses turning into neighborhoods, schools, and businesses. Every little bit of land that is open has either cows, fruit farms or a "for sale" sign on it or a combination. It is sad to see the loss of the greenery and the displacement of our cows and farms, but there is much progress and need within our community... including growing our own new Temple space as well.

Understanding these changes and growth, our curriculum will incorporate how we too can help with the needs of our community. A few years ago, serving at another Temple here in Florida, I took my 5th and 6th-grade class to a place called Molly's House. It is in downtown Stuart, quite close to a hospital. Molly's House is a place where patients and their families can stay for a short time while a patient is undergoing outpatient care and is required to be within a short distance of the hospital. Every room in the House was designed by a different family or organization for donation. There is a lovely sitting room with games and puzzles for young children and a library full of books.

There is an amazing garden at the back of the house which needed a little bit of a makeover. So, we donated mulch and flowers and other greenery, and the kids and some parents spent three hours updating and cleaning out the garden for Molly's House. Is that worship? You bet it is!! And, that is also someone's sanctuary.

All in all, the Temple Israel Religious School is my garden. My hope is to grow and plant as many seeds as I can in these incredible kids so that, along with our amazing teachers, parents and congregants, our "garden" becomes a garden of worship and prayer and power and love no matter where we are.

The Mussar Moment Rabbi Emeritus Howard Shapiro

Mussar is Poetry

Dr. Horowitz and I are talking about this coming year's Mussar course. We hear the word, and we think of old Rabbis with beards who live or lived lives we cannot reach up to. We think of reaching deep inside of ourselves and measuring our inadequacies against some sacred standard that is written in deep, black, thick Hebrew letters that scream from a yellowing paper page. We have taught you that Mussar means instruction, and we are called upon to learn from ourselves who we are and who we can become. We have said in these columns time and again Mussar is about growth and self-examination and climbing the rungs of our sacred ladder.

But what if I also said: Mussar is poetry? Some of you know I love Leonard Cohen^{z*I}. I'm in good company; so does Rabbi Salkin. For inspiration, I opened Cohen's "Book of Longing". There is a yellow sticky pad stuck to a page. It brings me to: "A Life of Errands".

"If you are lucky, you will grow old
And live a life of errands.
You will discern what people need
And provide it before they ask
And the fact that after years of
Spiritual rigour you did not manage
To enlighten yourself
A certain cheerfulness
Will begin to arise out of your crushed
Hopes and intentions...."

As my English teacher used to say: Let's parse this poem in a Mussar spirit. (We will only do two.) Start with "gratitude" – if you are lucky, you will grow old. Stop right there. Feel the blessing of wherever you are in life; find a way to be thankful no matter what your theology. It is one of the foundations of growing your spirit. Notice the cheerfulness of failed or crushed intentions. Success is not measured by how high you climb; holiness is the act of striving. It's hard but discover the joy of climbing even when the path up is filled with ruts. Crushed hopes are better than none and Mussar is a journey, not a destination.

Meanwhile: think about our new Mussar class – we don't have a title as of this writing – but we would love you to consider joining us. "If you are lucky, you will grow old and live..."
