From our Rabbis Rabbi Ryan Daniels and Rabbi Carlie Daniels

Finding Meaning, Connection and Relevance in the High Holy Days

The Torah scrolls are dressed in their majestic whites. Apples, honey and round challah are ready to be enjoyed. The synagogue building is abuzz as family, friends and guests file into the pews. Choir, piano and string music lift our spirits to new heights. Our hearts are open to imagine what is possible in 5784.

We invite you to step into the High Holy Days with us. As Rabbi Alan Lew writes, "Every heart needs to crack itself open. Every one of us needs to move from anger to healing, from denial to consciousness, from boredom to renewal. These needs did not arise yesterday. They are among the most ancient of human yearnings, and they are fully expressed in the pageantry and ritual of the Days of Awe, in the great journey we make between Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur" (This is Real and You Are Completely Unprepared, p. 9). We are honored to walk this path with you, collectively and as individuals, as we find meaning, connection and relevance in Judaism's age-old invitation at this season of reflection, repair and renewal.

Meaning

- Our clergy team, staff and lay partners have designed each worship service to be meaningful and accessible, including beautiful music, interpretive readings, inspiring sermons, and traditional prayers to create an experience befitting the Days of Awe.
- This year we will offer two opportunities for interactive text study on Yom Kippur: (1) A 1:00 PM
 afternoon session with Rabbi Howard Shapiro in the Media Center and (2) A 4:00 PM Afternoon
 Worship Service will include a conversation led by the clergy on contemporary applications of the
 Jonah Story.
- New this year: We invite families with young children to our 9:00 AM Family Experience on both Rosh Hashanah and Yom Kippur, a one-hour family program beginning with a half-hour prayer experience with accessible readings, prayers, music and age-appropriate story, followed by apples, round challah and hands-on activities.

Connection

- As is our custom throughout the year at Shabbat, our corps of ushers and greeters will welcome everyone into the building during the High Holy Days and will be present to assist throughout. Everyone is asked to wear a name tag given at check-in so that we can wish each other "Shanah Tovah!" by name, building meaningful connections with others.
- We are grateful to Sisterhood and Brotherhood who are partially sponsoring our annual Break-the-Fast at the end of Yom Kippur, an opportunity for the entire community to gather, eat delicious food, and enjoy the first moments of 5784 together.

Relevance

- In our Yom Kippur Haftarah portion, the prophet Isaiah asks, "Is this the fast I desire?" Meaning, if the age-old sanctuary-rituals of the High Holy Days do not move us to do the important soul-work and repair outside of the synagogue that our tradition compels, then the Holy Days are for nought. Therefore, among our service offerings this year, we are proud to offer a special *tikkun olam* ("repair of the world") community conversation at 2:00 PM in the Media Center.
- We know, too, that while prayer and reflection are essential offerings during the High Holy Days, tzedakah ("charitable giving") is equally important. We invite you to participate in this year's annual High Holy Day Food Drive which this year will begin on September 15 and end October 1 in order

The Mussar Moment Barry Horowitz, M.D.

Coming back from a recent trip to Europe, we had a connection in Paris at Charles de Gaulle Airport. For those of you who don't know that airport, it is large and unwieldy to get from terminal to terminal. Our flight into Paris was delayed, leaving us a little under an hour to catch the next flight back to the States. Upon landing, the plane stopped on the tarmac and not at a gate such that we had to take a bus to the terminal and then get to the next flight. My anxiety level soared. How could I retain my equanimity (menuchat ha'nefesh) while navigating this?

In my last Mussar Moment article, I discussed the fact that we really have little control as to what happens in our lives given all of the forces in the universe that are beyond our power. In sorting out what we do and do not have control over, I remarked that it is best to be patient in either case. In this circumstance, I exhorted myself and my wife to run like crazy people through the airport, cutting the passport line and bemoaning the drivers of the buses we had to get on for sticking to their schedules and not leaving so we could make our plane. I made both of us miserable with my un-Mussarlike behavior.

All of our worrying is about what might happen in the future. We can also see that all worrying is really a form of fear. The worry that seizes and freezes our hearts is all about fear over the possibilities that might come along in time. Would we make the flight? What would we do if we did not make it?

Worry (like all fear) triggers the fight-or-flight response, which, in turn, causes the body's sympathetic nervous system to release stress hormones such as cortisol. These hormones boost blood sugar levels and triglycerides (blood fats) in order to provide the body with the fuel it needs to deal with the threatening situation. But when the threat is all mental, these hormones have no physical outlet—no fight, no flight, only worry—then serious consequences can result, from immune suppression to digestive disorders to heart attack. As well, living under the cloud of worry can bring on mental health issues.

We made it to the gate in time, and in fact it was late boarding, but at what cost? In deciding what we can and cannot control, this becomes a central question to ask ourselves. Would it have been better to more calmly navigate the minefield of the airport and risk having to take a later flight or stay overnight in Paris or behave like a lunatic to bend the situation to the desired outcome? A basic tenet of Mussar is that life is a curriculum and that we constantly face situations that test us in order to allow us to grow towards wholeness (*shlemut*) and holiness. We face forks in the road (*bechira* points) where we can fall back on old behaviors or use the opportunity to use what we have learned and practice taking a more elevated approach. It is never easy, but always worthwhile.

Need A Ride?

Some of our members find it difficult to get to us as they are without a car or hesitate to drive at night. As such, our Temple Administrator Tamekia Graham has contacted **Palm Tran Connection** and has gathered the following information to assist our members in accessing our services and programs.

- Each person must individually register and book his or her trips
- A doctor's note is required certifying that a need exists e.g. stating a disability or even a mobility issue (use of walker, cane, wheelchair
- The cost of one ticket is \$3.50 (each way). Ticket books (10 tickets) are available for \$35. An aide or companion can accompany the rider for free
- The Palm Tran Connection runs Monday-Friday 5:30am to 9:30pm, Saturday 6am to 9pm, and Sunday 7:45am to 7:30pm
- Scheduling can be done 24 hours before, via phone or online
- To speak with a Palm Tran agent to determine qualifications, call (561) 649-9848. Once the rider is determined as eligible, the appropriate forms will be provided

The application and approval process typically takes 3 weeks to complete once all information is provided. More info can be found at: www.palmtran.org/paratransit-customer-service/






