This will be our first time participating in the Annual Reverse Tashlich, an international waterfront cleanup event. For thousands of years, in a ritual called Tashlich, Jews around the world have symbolically cast their sins into a body of water on Rosh Hashanah. For many years, too, humans have been throwing their sins, trash and debris, into bodies of water as well. The Jewish community has shown we can cast sins in, now let's take them out. The final service on Yom Kippur features the opportunity for those present to come up onto the bimah together for concluding prayers, Havdalah and the final shofar blast.

Congregants will receive an email confirmation upon registration; registrations are non-transferable. Children through age 26 are welcome to attend services with their family at no additional charge but they must register. If you have adult children over 26 years old, please encourage them to contact our team to discuss affiliation and high holy day services.

Members' guests are welcome. The cost is \$100 per out-of-county adult per holy day or \$125 per local adult per holy day. The cost for each child aged 12-18 is \$50 per holy day. Children under 12, college students, and active military are complimentary. Please submit the names of guests with your member registration for a guest to attend.

COMMUNITY GUESTS

We welcome visitors at our High Holy Day services for \$125 per adult per holy day and \$50 for each child aged 12-18 per holy day. Children under 12, college students, and active military are complimentary. Seats are limited, so please submit the paper or online registration as soon as possible in order to attend: Temple-Israel.com/hhd-guests.

RECIPROCITY

CONGREGANT AND GUEST CHECK-IN

Upon arriving at Temple, you will need to check in to receive your name tag before joining us for services in our Morris & Rose Kraft Sanctuary. Please plan to arrive early. Check-in will be in the David & Pauline Carter Ballroom. As always, there is open seating. Space is limited in the Kraft Sanctuary and our overflow seating will be in the Carter Ballroom, where our service will be streaming live.

SELF AND VALET PARKING

In addition to our parking lot on Pine Street (accessible only from Dixie Highway), valet parking will be available. Our porte-cochère is available for drop-off/pick-up but vehicles cannot idle or stand. Flagler Drive vehicle access on Pine will be closed by the Police.

ADDITIONAL WAYS TO PARTICIPATE: USHERS, GREETERS & OTHER VOLUNTEERS

Congregants can volunteer as ushers at one or more services—a great way to give back and meet new people! Ushers, identified by white carnations, will assist throughout the day. Please fill out the online or paper form by 8/31/2024. Temple Israel honors members by inviting them to participate in High Holy Days' services. This year, members will receive invitations from our rabbis, cantorial soloist, or the Honors Committee.

TALLITOT AND KIPPOT (OPTIONAL)

The Temple has a limited supply of tallitot and kippot available for use. A tallit is normally worn during daytime services only; the exception is Kol Nidre night, when it is also customary to wear one.

BIMAH ARRANGEMENT SPONSORSHIP

Yes, you can sponsor bimah arrangements during the High Holy Days, a beautiful display that can be offered in honor or memory of a loved one. The minimum donation is \$200. Your donation will be acknowledged in the High Holy Days handout. Due 8/31/2024.

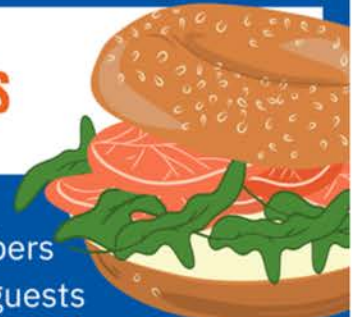
